- 1. In 2019 how many horses were slaughtered in total at licensed slaughterhouses in the UK?
- 2. (i) Where was the horse meat distributed to? (ii) Which countries was horse meat exported to?
- 3. If this information is recorded, what breeds of horses made up the total slaughter number eg. how many thoroughbreds, Dartmoor ponies etc?

Response

Point 1

The FSA is responsible for slaughterhouses in England, Northern Ireland and Wales. Food Standards Scotland is responsible for slaughterhouses in Scotland.

During 2019 in England, Northern Ireland and Wales a total of 2,165 animals in the soliped/equidea category were presented at slaughter for human consumption.
