Response

Prior to April 2010 Meat Hygiene Inspectors (MHIs) were employed by the Meat Hygiene Service and were therefore not employed by the Food Standards Agency (FSA). MHIs only became FSA employees following the merger in April 2010.

It should be noted that the figures provided in the table below only refer to MHIs employed directly by the FSA. In order to support the operational delivery requirements to provide a MHI resource in approved premises, the FSA works closely with our Shared Business Partners who provide additional MHI resources.

At the beginning of the current financial year the Shared Business Partners provided 275 additional MHIs.

The figures in the table for 2011-2015 include FSA employed MHIs in England, Scotland and Wales. However, the figures for 2016 onwards only include FSA employed MHIs from England and Wales due to Food Standards Scotland (FSS) being established on 01 April 2015.
